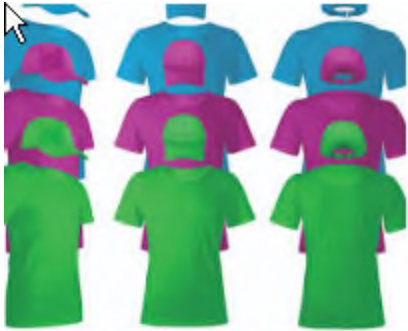

Minutes - Kettle Moraine Riders Snowmobile Club
Tuesday, February 5, 2019
Sideliners, North Prairie, WI

Meeting called to order at 7:12 p.m. by President Craig Keys.

Attendance: 20

New Members: No new members in attendance.

Secretary's report: The Minutes from January 8, 2019, were in the newsletter. Karen Johnson motioned to approve, Dan Turkoske seconded.

Motion to accept by Dan Turkoske, Clint Kilpatrick seconded. Dave Douglas collected for the 50/50 raffle.

Board Meeting: No January meeting.

Guest: Chris O'Sullivan from Liberty Mutual introduced himself to the group. He purchased pizzas for the group and handed out contact cards for those interested in obtaining a quote. He said that those who completed the contact card would be put into a drawing to win one of two \$25 Amazon cards.

Trailmaster: Chad rode into the forest and encountered a cross country race with people running on the trails. Dan will look into this. Trails opened January 23 and were open 11 days. Trails were in good to excellent condition. Waukesha County has the most registered sleds in the state. Dan fixed a few downed signs. The DNR made a heavy appearance in the area the first open weekend. Dan knows of two people stopped for unregistered sleds, and they had to purchase trail passes right there. Dan asked that if anyone sees downed signs or any issues on the trails to please contact him. Dan would like to purchase a third pole saw for brushing. They usually cost \$600-\$700. Dave Kalusche will get a quote from Bill at Bill's Power Center, and Craig will talk to Jensen Equipment. Jim Kilpatrick motioned to

spend \$700, Tim Arquette seconded. Dan talked about the county text system. It works really well for those that have used it. Jim Kilpatrick talked about grooming. He requested more signs in the forest. One of the problems is that the DNR does not want them nailed to trees. They want the signs on a 4x4 wood post, a number of feet down into the ground. We will have to look into getting proper equipment and the time to do this when we have warmer weather. Jim was able to groom three complete circuits while the trails were open.

County news: The youth ride in Monches was on Saturday, February 2. They had 21 kids. They thanked all of the clubs for donating to the cause. The President and Vice President positions are both open for anyone interested.

Webmaster: Nothing new on the website.

Old Business: There was a positive response to the meeting at Road, Track & Trail in January. We will plan on having our January 2020 meeting there next year.

Nominations: Nominations for Vice President, Treasurer, and two board members will be taken. Dave Kalusche and Steve Piraino's terms are up. Dave Kalusche agreed to run again as a board member. Dave Douglas agreed to run again as Vice President. Jim Kilpatrick nominated JJ Eckl as a board member. JJ Eckl nominated Clinton Kilpatrick as a board member. Watch for a ballot via email. We will also be voting on Snowmobiler of the Year, which will be a write-in on the ballot.

Vickie is stepping down as Treasurer. Craig asked if anyone would be interested in doing the monthly newsletter. Chris Kalusche offered to do it if no one else would.

Fundraiser: Karen Keys briefly discussed the fundraiser meat raffle on Saturday, March 16, at Eagle Springs Pub. Flyers were printed by Chris Kalusche and distributed to those who can post them at a business. Watch for emails regarding volunteering to help that day. We will have bucket raffle items so if you would like to donate a basket or anything, please let Karen know so she can plan for it. She asked if anyone has a megaphone we could borrow for the event.

Club Trip 2019: We had a good turnout of members at Land O'Lakes. There were no injuries and only two sled breakdowns. It was a great time despite the sub-zero temps.
